I. CALL TO ORDER

A. Certification of Public Notice.

Mayor Suarez called the meeting to order and certified the public notice of the meeting as properly posted Friday, October 30, 2015.

B. Invocation.

Pastor Richard Speer, Grace Episcopal Church, led the invocation.

C. Pledge of Allegiance.

The Mayor led the Pledge of Allegiance and Texas Flag.

D. Roll Call.

Ms. Elizabeth Walker, City Secretary, called the roll, noting the absences of Mayor Pro-Tem Noriega and Commissioners Tafolla, Fox, Rivera. No quorum was established.

II. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mr. Richard Voss expressed concern about the drainage ditch on South Border Avenue, which he believes resulted in flooding at Westgate Woods subdivision.

Mayor Pro-Tem Noriega and Commissioner Fox arrived at 5:38 p.m.

At 5:45 p.m., Commissioner Fox, seconded by Mayor Pro-Tem Noriega, moved to recess the regular meeting of November 3, 2015 until 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, November 4, 2015. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

Commissioner Fox, seconded by Commissioner Tafolla, moved to approve consent agenda items as presented A2, B, C, D, F, G, I, J, and K. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

The City Manager clarified the Minutes of October 20, 2015 to reflect the item pertaining to the Quintanilla alley abandonment should be by first reading of ordinance, similar to that of the South Palm Garden Estates, with second reading of that ordinance next Commission meeting.

Commissioner Tafolla, seconded by Commissioner Fox, moved to approve consent agenda item A1 as clarified. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

Commissioner Kerr noted his conflicts of interest statement filed on item III. E. Commissioner Fox, seconded by Commissioner Tafolla, moved to approve consent agenda item E as presented. The motion carried with Commissioner Kerr abstaining; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

Assistant Chief Walensky explained the proposed Ordinance 2015-36 allows the City Manager and City Attorney authorization to inspect "G-files" held by the Police Chief; the City Manager explained this allows oversight of the Chief and preparation for litigation. This is a requirement for Civil Service communities in compliance with 143, as stipulated by Attorney General opinion, and authorization is not extended to any member of the Commission.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Tafolla, moved to approve consent agenda item III. H as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

AN ORDINANCE ABANDONING A 20' X 830' ALLEY LOCATED BEHIND LOTS 1-4 BLK 1 SOUTH PALM GARDEN ESTATE PHASE 1 AND LOTS 5-8 BLK 1 SOUTH PALM GARDEN ESTATES PHASE 2; CREATING A 20' X 830' UTILITY EASEMENT BEHIND LOTS 1-4 BLK 1 SOUTH PALM GARDEN ESTATE PHASE 1 AND LOTS 5-8 BLK 1 SOUTH PALM GARDEN ESTATES PHASE 2; AND ORDAINING OTHER MATTER WITH RESPECT TO THE SUBJECT MATTER HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF WESLACO TEXAS THAT:

SECTION I. It is in the interest of the City of Weslaco to abandon the 20' X 830' alley located behind lots 1-4 Blk 1 South Palm Garden Estate Phase 1 and Lots 5-8 Blk 1 South Palm Garden Estates Phase 2 and creating a utility easement instead.

SECTION II. The alley described above in Section I of this ordinance is hereby designated as a 20' x 830' Public Utility Easement.

ORDINANCE NO. 2015-33

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ZONING ORDINANCE NO. 320 AND AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF WESLACO TO CHANGE THE ZONING OF 1901 W. BUS 83, ALSO BEING A 0.38 ACRE OUT OF FARM TRACT 633, WEST TRACT SUBDIVISION, WESLACO, HIDALGO COUNTY, TEXAS, FROM R-1 ONE FAMILY DWELLING DISTRICT TO B-1 NEIGHBORHOOD BUSINESS DISTRICT

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF WESLACO, TEXAS:

SECTION I: R-1 Single Family Dwelling District to B-1 Neighborhood Business District. being 0.38 acre out of Farm Tract 633, West Tract Subdivision, also being 1901 W. Business 83, Weslaco, Hidalgo County, Texas.

SECTION II: That this ordinance shall become effective upon its passage.

ORDINANCE 2015-34

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 200, 1969-18, AND 1986-27, THE CITY OF WESLACO TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDINANCE; CODIFIED AS ARTICLE III; BY AMENDING SECTION 134-142 PARKING LOT PAVEMENT MARKINGS, OF THE WESLACO CODE OF ORDINANCES, ADOPTING NEW REGULATIONS; AND ORDAINING OTHER MATTERS WITH RESPECT TO THE SUBJECT MATTER HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF WESLACO TEXAS THAT:

SECTION I.

Ordinance 200 passed and approved on September 17, 1951 as "Traffic Regulation Ordinance" and Codified as Article III Section 134-142 Parking Lot Pavement Markings of the Weslaco Code of Ordinances is hereby amended.

SECTION II.

After second and final reading of this Ordinance the new peddlers and solicitors ordinance will be adopted and codified as Article III, Section 134-142 Parking Lot Pavement Markings of the Weslaco Code of Ordinances and said Section shall read as follows:

SECTION 134-142 PARKING LOT PAVEMENT MARKINGS

In all residential and commercial parking lots where more than two off-street parking spaces are required, the following colors shall be used for pavement markings:

- (1) *White or Yellow.* The color that shall be used to designate parking spaces shall be in contrasting colors to the surface of the parking lot.
- (2) *Yellow.* The color yellow shall be used to designate "No Parking Areas" and loading zones; and
- (3) *Red.* The color red shall be used to designate fire lanes.

All public improvement project parking lots are required to in compliance with Texas Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

V. OLD BUSINESS

- A. Discussion and consideration to approve final payment to Prodigy Construction Management LLC related to Valley Nature Center. Possible action. (This item was tabled on October 20, 2015; Staffed by City Manager's Office.) Attachment.

Commissioner Fox, seconded by Commissioner Kerr, moved to remove the item from the table. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

The City Manager recommended tabling the item until next meeting to allow review and evaluation of information recently received.

Commissioner Fox, seconded by Commissioner Kerr, moved to table this item as recommended. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

- A. Discussion and consideration to request Hidalgo County Drainage District to assist in obtaining a permit from the International Boundary and Water Commission to construct additional gates to the floodway. Possible action. (Staffed by City Manager's Office.) Attachment.

The City Manager explained a 10X10 box can move as much water in two hours as a pump in 24-hours. He recommended initiating the long process toward installing additional boxes to improve drainage for the City, working with the Drainage District and the International Boundary and Water Commission for access points. The cost is approximately \$10 million per box, which Precinct 1 indicated would be willing to share. The City Manager recommended three boxes over three years, one each for Las Brisas, South Border, and Downtown areas. The Mayor stated meanwhile he suggests no variances on retention, Mr. Mardoqueo Hinojosa stated the current retention regulations are among the most stringent in the Valley.

Commissioner Tafolla, seconded by Commissioner Kerr, moved to approve the item as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

- B. Discussion and consideration to approve the purchase of three (3) twelve inch (12") water pumps from Odessa Pumps, Buyboard Vendor Contract No. 418-13 in an amount not to exceed \$193,500.00 and authorize the Mayor to execute any related documents. Possible action. (Staffed by Public Works Department.) Attachment.

The City Manager noted this does not include hoses, which he hopes will be on the next agenda, but can be delivered within weeks of authorizing payment. He noted the City only had one six inch pump at the time of the flood.

Commissioner Tafolla, seconded by Commissioner Fox, moved to approve the item as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

- C. Discussion and consideration to approve the Initial Facility Deficiency List with Purchases as recommended by Severn Trent Services for the operations of Water and Wastewater Facilities, and authorize the Mayor to execute all related documents and budget amendment as may be required. Possible Action. (Requested by Severn Trent Services). Attachment.

Mr. Trinidad Cantu, on behalf of Severn Trent, presented a list to identify two pumps at each lift station, with 51 lift stations in 14-square mile area. Approximately five stations do not have a second pump; others have pumps in poor working condition. The City Manager stated this expense would be applied against the \$250,000.00 capital improvement account within the contract.

Commissioner Kerr, seconded by Commissioner Rivera, moved to approve the item as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

- D. Discussion and consideration to approve a Professional Services Agreement with the Valley Nature Center in an amount not to exceed \$35,000.00 as recommended by the Weslaco Hotel Occupancy Tax Advisory Committee and authorize the Mayor to

execute any related documents. Possible action. (Staffed by Finance Department.) Attachment.

Ms. Mary Barrera recommended approval stating the committee had evaluated the application for funding and met the criteria requirements.

Commissioner Fox, seconded by Commissioner Tafolla, moved to approve as presented. The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

VII. DEPARTMENT UPDATES

A. Report by Weslaco Area Chamber of Commerce. Attachment.

Ms. Martha Noell unveiled new marketing plans, particularly in Mexico during select holidays. The Chamber created four themed day tours of Weslaco and RV park directors already have enrolled. Local hotels request the City host summer sports tournaments in order to increase overnight stays.

B. Report by Economic Development Corporation of Weslaco.

On behalf of Mr. Joey Trevino, who is attending the International Convention of Shopping Centers with Ms. Elizabeth Walker, the City Manager reported on efforts to recruit a business to the airport, the incubator through UT-RGV, and EDA grant improvements.

C. Report by Planning and Code Enforcement Department - Engineering and Animal Control.

Mr. Mardoqueo Hinojosa reported on Border Avenue street improvements, 6th Street waterline improvements, and the Boys and Girls Club construction. Also, the City is considering issuing a 90-day permit to use a recreational vehicle parked adjacent to residences while the homes are under renovation following the flood.

Mr. Joe Pedraza reported on animal and vector control activities, with the entire City already sprayed for mosquitoes and two more sprays expected within the next two weeks. Schedules are posted to the City and Police web and Facebook pages.

D. Report by Public Works Department - Water and Wastewater Systems and Severn Trent transition.

Mr. Pete Garcia reported Public Works is working closely with Code Enforcement on demolishing buildings, with Parks Department on cemetery gate repair, with the contractor to pave Sixth Street, and with the leased excavator to stair step drainage ditches. The City Manager reported the City Secretary has met with disaster relief non-profit organizations to facilitate their service delivery in Weslaco.

Mr. Trinidad Cantu reported that of 19 employees, eight transferred from the City, bringing their institutional knowledge. The transition is going well.

E. Report by Parks and Recreation Department.

Mr. David Arce expressed appreciation to Code Enforcement and Public Works departments. He reported restroom doors are being replaced at Harlon Block Park; the equipment recently authorized this fiscal year has arrived; he plans to resurface basketball courts and procure a new playground within the next few months.

VIII. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 7:03 p.m., the Mayor announced the regular meeting to convene in Executive Session. At 7:39 p.m., the Mayor announced the City Commission had completed its Executive Session and reconvened the regular meeting as open to the public.

The motion carried unanimously; Mayor Suarez was present and voting.

The City Attorney confirmed that was his legal opinion.
